The Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training bridges gaps between law enforcement and mental health care professionals. Officers participate in 40 hours of mental health training covering topics such as community resources, diagnosis, medications, suicide, substance use disorders, and de-escalation strategies.

The goal of CIT is to provide immediate response and management of situations where mentally ill people are in a state of crisis. Designed to prevent, reduce, and eliminate injury to officers and individuals, this training helps CIT trained officers in dealing with situations to reduce recidivism.

Trainings are limited to 20 officers; first come, first served.
