About OCHN

OCHN is a publicly funded, Prepaid Inpatient Health Plan (PIHP) that manages a network of expert service providers who support approximately 23,000 Oakland County citizens at more than 300 service sites. Most of these individuals have Medicaid insurance coverage. OCHN also:

- Aligns its priorities with the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), ensuring people have access to integrated, healthcare services and supports that improve quality of life and promote engagement in full community participation.
- Is an innovative leader, guided by the social determinants of health and the voices of the people it supports.
- Is National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) accredited. NCQA provides a comprehensive framework for organizations like OCHN to align and improve operations in areas that are most important to states, employers, and persons served.
